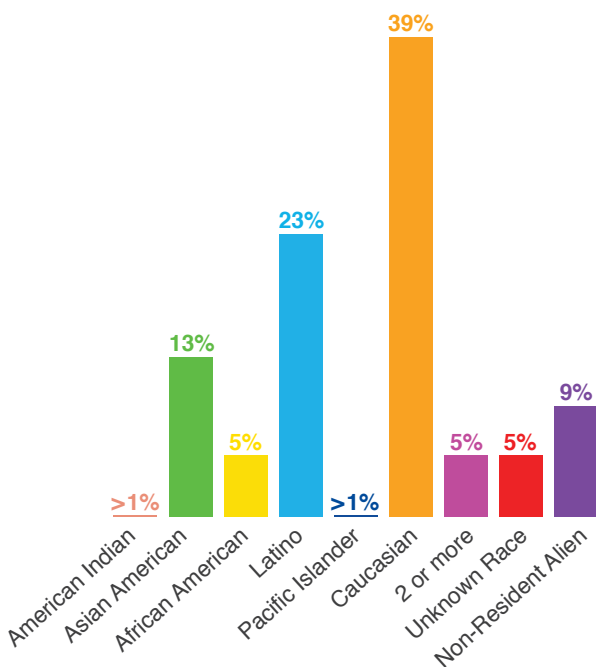

The Association of Independent California Colleges

and Universities (AICCU) is the collective voice for 79 WASC-accredited, private, nonprofit higher education institutions in the state. Independent colleges and universities formed AICCU in 1955 to partner with the state when what is now called the Cal Grant program was created. While AICCU speaks on a myriad of policy and budget issues, the Cal Grant program remains—after more than 60 years—the hallmark of our engagement and partnership with California. The core of the missions of AICCU institutions is to provide access to higher education opportunities for Californians no matter their background; and to graduate the next generation of leaders who are ready to contribute to their communities and California's workforce.

- AICCU institutions enroll 22% of undergraduate students in California in four-year institutions, nearly 186,000 students.
- AICCU institutions enroll 56%—the majority—of graduate students in California, nearly 152,000 students, making the sector the leader in producing the state's advanced workforce.
- AICCU institutions enroll over 27,000 Cal Grant students and 50,000 Pell Grant students.
- AICCU institutions proudly serve California and its workforce needs, as 76% of undergraduate students are residents of the state.
