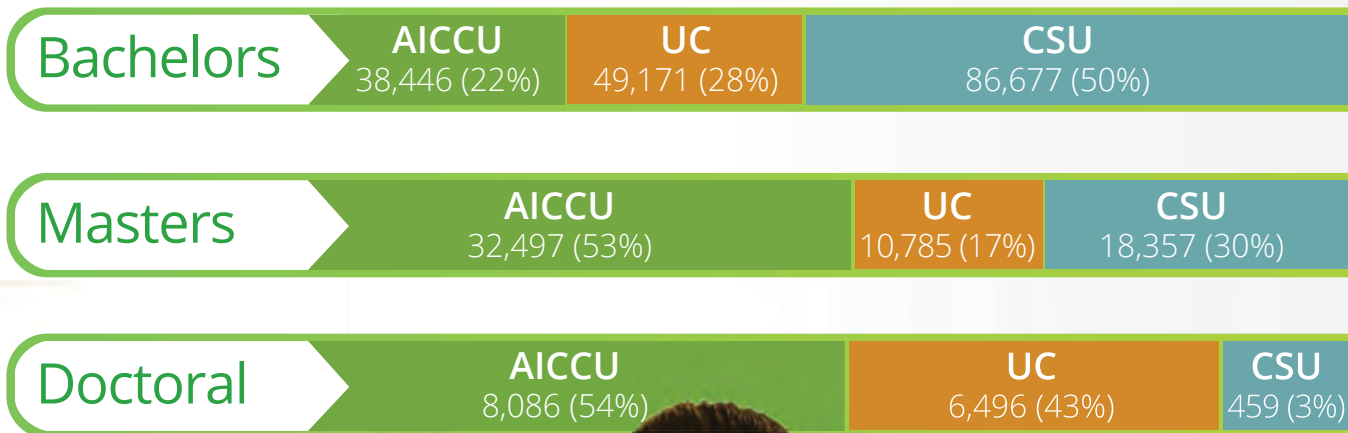

AICCU Share of CA Degrees

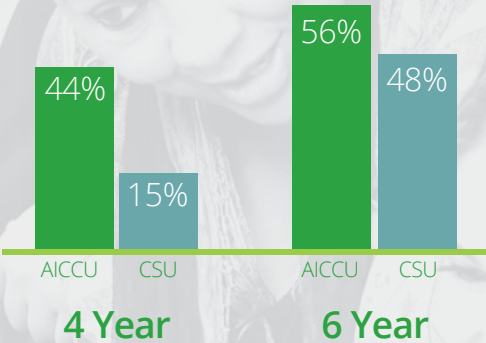

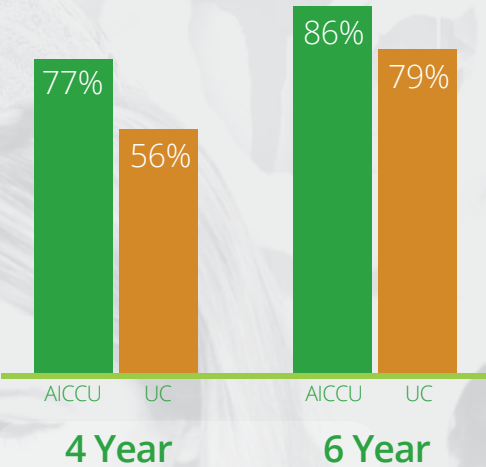
